I would also like to see any members that are available to come to a rally this Thursday August 19<sup>th</sup> 2021 at 4:00 p.m. Covid protocols in place masks and social distancing.

In March of this year the Sheraton Hotel Ottawa terminated approximately 70 employees who were on temporary leave due to the pandemic. This union representing the employees UNITE HERE Local 261 had repeatedly attempted to meet with the employer to extend the recall period. The employer refused. Numerous organizations and individuals including the Ottawa Labour Council, have expressed their disappointment and demand the employees, some with over 20 years working at the hotel, be hired back. The Ontario Federation of Labour has called for a boycott of the hotel. It is estimated that through meetings, conferences and conventions over a ten year time period unions including { OSSTF} have contributed in excess of a million dollars to the Sheraton Hotel Ottawa. With the boycott those monies come to a full stop. A rally at the Sheraton Ottawa Hotel in support of the terminated employees is planned for August 19th, 2021 at 4:00pm. Safety protocols will be in place including masks and social distancing. Those participating are asked to bring their union flag. Its important the affected employees see the broad union and community support.
